### THE NEWTON LIMAVADY UNION WORKHOUSE

Nearly 200 years ago, poverty was widespread throughout Ireland. The rural community of the Roe Valley was suffering greatly from homelessness, hunger, and disease. There were no government allowances for the elderly, sick or unemployed. Many of the families who lived in mud huts with roofs made of straw, died from cholera, cold and starvation. They had to pay rent for these dwellings as the land they were living on belonged to someone else. However, with no jobs and no way of earning a living or paying the rent, families were evicted, thrown out of their homes, forced to live on the roads. Something had to be done.

In 1838 the government set up the Poor Relief Act, which divided the whole of Ireland into 'Unions'. Each Union had to build a workhouse for the destitute poor in the area. One hundred and forty-six Workhouses were built in Ireland. Work started on The Newton Limavady Union Workhouse in 1838 and opened its doors on 15<sup>th</sup> March 1842. You might think that the opening of the workhouse would make life bearable for the old people, sick and homeless families in the Roe Valley area. In fact, it was a place of dread, shame, and a last resort for many. Why was this so? Why was it a place of dread and shame? The Poor Law Commissioners who designed and operated the Workhouse system, ruled that it should be 'the hardest taskmaster, the cruelest paymaster and the most harsh and unkind friend'. The regime was very strict and unwelcoming. This discouraged people from coming to the workhouse and staying there. On entering, families were split up. Husbands were separated from their wives, parents from their children and sisters from their brothers. Families were allowed to meet up at prayer and meal times only. Infants could remain with their mothers until the age of 2, when they would be placed in a separate room to which the mothers would have 'reasonable access'. In the Workhouse, life was organized in such a manner that the paupers would want to leave as soon as possible.

Newtown Limavady Workhouse closed its doors on 1st April 1930 and it was converted into the Roe Valley District Hospital in 1932. The hospital operated from then until 1989 when, once again the doors were closed.

Two years previously, in 1987, a charity called 'Limavady Community Development Initiative' (LCDI) had been started by a group of local people who were very concerned at the high level of unemployment in the area. Their main purpose was to create job opportunities. The charity purchased the Workhouse/ Hospital building and with the additional space were able to house a range of projects so ensuring the outstanding 'hidden jewel' of the Roe Valley would continue to serve the community, as it is still doing today.

About fifty yards North of the entrance to Scroggy Road Health Centre can be seen on the left-hand side a small memorial stone marked:

# LIMAVADY UNION GRAVEYARD THIS CONSECRATED PLOT WAS USED AS A WORKHOUSE BURIAL GROUND **BETWEEN THE YEARS 1841 – 1931**

In March every year a memorial service is held there to remember all the people buried in the Paupers' Graveyard and all the families who were left with no choice but to enter the grim life of the Workhouse. May they all rest in peace.
